I know this all sounds bad but it is standard operating procedure if you have anything that appears to be successful in Honduras, especially where a school is involved. God has blessed here and has put the ministry in a strong financial position. It's just that we don't want to give everything away to the government or disgruntled workers and ex church members.

(Remember the 2 brothers who sued and were rewarded 36,000? We still owe them 11 payments and we're done) Through all of this God keeps richly blessing and we have big plans for the future. Thanks so much for your prayers. They really do sustain missionaries working on the field. God bless and have a wonderful year serving God.
